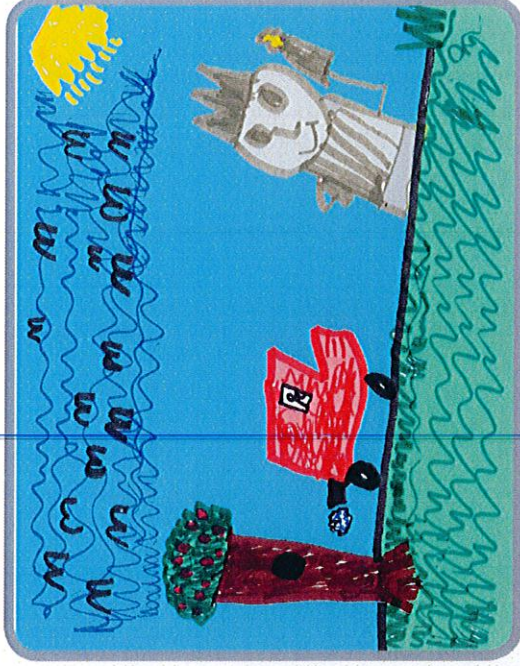




up many of her favorite treats. She had not even entered the Disney theme parks and already it felt like paradise.


